

FOLLOWING HOT on the heels of the news of an increase in the number of pedigree puppies registered in 2008, the Kennel Club has just announced that the official entry figure for this year's Crufts again confirms the ongoing and overwhelming popularity of dogs.

Around 28,000 dogs are expected to attend Crufts 2009, with a total of 22,677 dogs entered into breed judging and the Agility and Obedience Championships. This represents one of the highest entry figures yet.



Dogs achieving an award from the gamekeeper classes will be asked to perform a retrieve to display the general requirements expected to work in the sporting field.

BASC's national gundog co-ordinator, James Green, said: "The gamekeepers' classes have grown in popularity year on year and with over four hundred gundogs competing in 2009 it promises to be the best year to date. The gamekeeper classes are always interesting to watch but the addition of a retrieve will make the event even more exciting."

Don't forge like a busy high street, complex road junction, railway or bus station, or a crowded shop - people with sight loss sometimes need a bit of help to get around, even if they have

a guide dog or use a cane.

The charity's 'How to guide' booklet and DVD clearly illustrate five helpful hints to enable people to feel confident in applying guiding techniques, should the need arise to offer assistance to a person with sight loss. These five helpful hints are:

I. Say who you are and offer help. Communicate clearly and listen to the visually impaired person's request (they will confirm if they want sighted guided assistance).

2. Ask where and how the person would like to be guided.

3. Allow the person to take your arm rather than holding theirs.

4. Say if you are approaching steps (and if they are going up or down),

5. Don't forget to say when you have finished providing the assistance and are leaving the person.

Guide Dogs will also be highlighting good practice in approaching and assisting a guide dog owner. This will include tips such as:

1. Never distract a guide dog in harness.The dog will be concentrating on guiding its owner and, if distracted, it might put itself and its owner in danger. Ignore the guide dog completely at all times, both when it is in harness or on a lead, and even avoid eye contact.

2. A guide dog owner will indicate the need for sighted guide assistance when the dog is in harness by allowing the harness-handle to lie on the dog's back, whilst keeping hold of the

3. As a guide dog always walks on the left of the owner, allow the owner to take your left arm if they require sighted guide assistance.

4. Never tell a guide dog what to do as it is up to the guide dog owner to give the dog instructions and directions

Mic Martin's no nonsense approach to training comes from a long career as a police dog handler and has earned him the reputation as being one of Britain's toughest TV trainers.

However, underneath the tough guy exterior is a compassionate man who really understands the difficulties faced by disabled people and the huge influence dogs can have on our lives as he ended up in a wheelchair himself for a year in 1996. Mic's career in the police force came to an abrupt end when he sustained a serious injury to his knee while in pursuit of thugs who had burgled a pensioner. After 26 hospital appointments, two major operations and a year unable to walk, Mic found himself out of the job he loved, housebound and feeling sorry for himself.

The former cop's life was transformed when his wife suggested they rehome a rescue Border Collie. Zak pulled Mic out of his depression and the pair were soon training for working trials. Mic still has to wear a leg brace but this has never stopped him entering competitions or held him back when the BBC asked him to appear on Dog Borstal. He is incredibly passionate about his work and has been hugely successful on film sets all over the world as well as training working dogs.

'I've trained dogs to do amazing things like being able to detect explosives and drugs but I am truly in awe of the work Support Dogs does training assistance dogs to alert their owners to epileptic seizures, for example,' explained Mic.



'Having been a bit of an action man myself I hated asking people to do things for me. I know how it feels to be unable to do the things I once took for granted and I am extremely lucky to have made a full recovery. With the assistance of a fully trained dog it is possible to give someone not as lucky as me a chance of independence,' he added.

Support Dogs is a unique UK charity dedicated to improving the quality of life for people with physical disabilities, epilepsy and the families of autistic children. It currently trains three main types of assistance dog: Disability Assistance Dogs, Autism Assistance Dogs and Seizure Alert Dogs. The groundbreaking charity trained Britain's first Seizure Alert Dog back in 1994 who, within three months, was giving his owner a 30-minute warning of every epileptic seizure.

Support dogs go through continuous training throughout their working careers, giving their owners increased confidence and self-esteem in addition to the extra independence that these special breeds of assistance

dogs bring. Each assistance dog costs in the region of £10,000 to train and care for throughout his working life so funds are always needed to help more people benefit from these highly specialist dogs.





ONNIE IRVING has had a busy year. Since August 2008, the KC Chairman has been thrust into the public glare more than any other Chairman before him.


With the eyes of the world of dogs and the world in general focussed squarely on the Kennel Club's every move, OUR DOGS Editor, Ali Smith, caught up with him...



A. I'm at home in King's Sutton just near to Banbury in Oxfordshire.

Q. Crufts is upon us yet again and the entry is extremely good, with a huge increase in overseas entries. Were you worried that entries would be affected for 2009 by last year's

A. Not really Throughout all this period of criticism from nay-sayers and those who want to knock us dog people, a number of things have become evident. The dog loving general public don't swallow everything that the knockers try to tell them. The level of registration of pedigree dogs at the Kennel Club has stood up well so far. The enquiry level from the general public on the Kennel Club's "Find a Puppy" section of our Website hasn't ever missed a beat. Discover Dogs in London in November went down very well with the dog loving public. On top of all that, the interest that Crufts gets from dog people in the UK and all over the world, is just phenomenal. So with UK championship shows down as much as about 5% last year because of credit crunches and fuel costs being so high, we didn't expect an increase for Crufts. But we're delighted that the entry is so good. That it's over the 22,500 mark is really great and I think it's the third highest entry ever. So I'd like to say a big thank you to everyone who has entered. We will show the BBC and others what a big mistake they have all made!




A. Yes – the permanent full time professional team at Clarges Street is first class and I'll come back to that in a minute. But of course I'm not at Clarges Street every day you know. Being Chairman of the Kennel Club is just a voluntary position and I don't get paid for doing it. Not many people realise that – but it's true. None of the General and other Committee Members including me, gets paid a penny for what we do. We get our travel expenses and lunch but that's all. But when I am at Clarges Street, there's no real typical day. That's the fun of it – there is huge variation. One minute you are in meetings, the next you are dealing with distinguished and sometimes undistinguished visitors, then overseas' kennel clubs then just the simple drudgery of reading endless paperwork. But returning to the professional team; the Kennel Club's policy is set by the Committees but the carrying out of these policies is in the hands of the professional team led by Rosemary Smart the Chief Executive and Caroline Kisko the Secretary. It is that team that is there on a daily basis and on whom we depend for the successful execution of the Committee's policy decisions. And what a dedicated team we have – all dog lovers proud to work for the Kennel Club on behalf of dogs and many of them also personally involved in the world of dogs as breed ers, exhibitors and competitors.

Q. The Accredited Breeder Scheme is becoming more popular. Do you think this will have an effect on 'backstreet' breeders

A. Hopefully yes - that's the aim - to get rid of irresponsible breeders completely, if that's what you mean by 'backstreet breeders'. The intention is to create a sort of 'kitemark' for the breeders you can trust. The health testing requirements, paperwork guarantees, standards of care and welfare, socialisation of puppies – all the things that good breeders care about – are included in the scheme. Once we get enough people into the scheme we'll be able to push it harder and harder with the dog buying public. Our hope is that eventually the public will learn to demand the standards set by the scheme from every breeder and that will, we hope, eventually put the backstreet breeder - as you put it - out of business. The scheme is growing rapidly but we still need more of the dyed-in-the-wool show breeders to come on board. Of course we know they already are, by and large, the most responsible breeders but we need to have them inside the scheme and lead-

ing it - not standing outside it - saying that they don't need to join. We know they think they don't need to join but we believe they eventually will need to, for their own protection. And besides, we need them to be part of it all, and to help create the high standards and reputation that we all want



A. Well, I think that for a start our championship shows are much bigger. Last year the average entry for General Championship Shows here, was over 10,000 and as many as 14 of our shows had more than 9,000 dogs entered. That means that most of our

largest of the European Shows except for their special annual FCI 'World' or 'European' Shows and you have to remember that the biggest show in the USA attracts an entry of just around 3,500 so their shows are quite small by our standards. Another difference is that we still have Open and Limited shows which don't have CC status. Hardly any other country in the world has more than a handful of shows that don't have championship status - and most have no such shows at all. From that and the size differences, there flow a whole lot of other differences. Our shows are benched and by and large theirs are not. Our shows have more specialists and less all round judges than others do. Our judges have much more hands-on experience of judging at open show level before they are permitted to judge at championship show level. We have far fewer professional handlers than they do and by and large far more of our show dogs here are also family pets. Oh $-\$ and it's much more difficult here to make up a champion than it is in most other countries. In the USA for example, in my breed, Border Terriers, there were more champions made up in the last two years than we have had since the breed was recognised by the KC in 1920! That's why our shows and shows like Crufts are so very highly regarded all over the world.

Q. As an exhibitor, do you feel that dog showing has changed in the last 15 years?

A. Not so much in the last 15 years as in the last 30 or 40 years of course but yes – it has changed a bit. I think that the overall standard of organisation of championship shows has improved greatly as have the facilities for exhibitors- such as catering, toilets etc. The late Mrs Catherine Sutton brought standards of amenity and showmanship to a peak at Windsor and Richmond Shows when she was Secretary there. Those two shows were, in my opinion, well ahead of most of the others for a number of years. Now most championship shows attain just as high a level as those two shows did then - and that's good. Open and Limited Shows seemed to be much bigger and then declined. But I think that, as a result of some of the controls that the KC put in a few years ago, plus changes to Junior Warrants, introduction of Show Certificates of Merit etc, things have improved. Though there are now fewer open shows, those that remain are the better ones and their size, entries, classes and breeds scheduled are now much more sensible and create rather a better atmosphere of competition than before the changes

As far as exhibitors are concerned, there seem, in some breeds more than



shows are bigger than the **l** Judging Border Terriers at a Westminster Show in 2007

others, to be far more people who don't breed much and just show one or at the most two dogs. This leads to a different set of priorities for exhibitors - rather too many of whom I think go just to win, rather than to compare their dogs against the dogs of other breeders. There are far fewer large kennels around and that again creates a different atmosphere and a different set

As far as the dogs are concerned some breeds have improved tremendously some haven't, some have grown and some have declined in numbers. Standards of presentation have changed and I personally think we see far more exaggerated presentation than we did before - and far more than is good for

What plans do the KC's Charitable Trust have for 2009/10?

A. Well of course I'm not a Trustee of the Kennel Club Charitable Trust, but I am of course aware from Mike Townsend, who is its Chairman, that one of the Trust's main plans is to support a Genetics Centre at the AHT. This will, for example, develop several DNA tests every year and calculate Estimated Breeding Values for breeds such as the CKCS and Labrador - to guide breeders in the formation of appropriate breeding plans so as to minimise the effect of certain hereditary conditions. The Kennel Club Charitable Trust will also fund further scientific research into various canine conditions by offering up to £500,000 over the next two years to acceptable projects. The Trust hopes through it's recently appointed Ambassadors, and through improved press coverage, to extend the awareness all of its activities. These activities, in addition to the above, also include support for the training of assistance dogs that help human beings live a more fulfilled life. Of course these objectives all depend on financial support - not just from the Kennel Club - but also from breeders, breed clubs, Agria Insurance and other benefactors. Every penny of the funds received is put to good use in the Trust's job of "making a difference for dogs"

Q. Aside from Border Terriers, in which other breeds do you have an interest?

A. We also have two Dandie Dinmont Terriers. Kate and her mother have

had them since the mid 1960s and in fact Kate bred Dandie Champions in her own name before she bred any Border Terrier champions. My grandfather as well as having Bor-der Terriers had a couple of Bull Terriers and I showed one of them long ago. I also showed a Norfolk by the well known Ch Ickworth Ready - but very unsuccessfully. If I didn't have Borders I think I'd like to have a Bull Terrier or two. I choose not to judge any breeds in the UK while I am Kennel Club Chairman - ex- how Claudius cept Border Terriers

but if you were to ask me what breed I would like to judge at championship show level that I am not passed to judge - I'd say Dalmatians

Q. What's your favourite part of your job? A.There you go again – it's not a job! But there are so many things I enjoy about being Chairman that I wouldn't want to single any one out. Chairing meetings is always a challenge and meeting some really interesting people is very rewarding. I think one of the things that British dog people don't understand is just how highly both the Kennel Club and the British dog scene are respected overseas. It is good to meet people from other country kennel clubs and find out what problems, successes and ideas they have. You can learn a great deal from that experience. But I enjoy going to dog shows to compete as an exhibitor just as much as being Chairman of the Kennel Club.

... and least favourite?

A. Dealing with letters from people who are moaning about other people in dogs or complaining about breed clubs, shows, rules or judges etc. Some of these people have lost the plot and have lost sight of the fact that we are in this dog game of ours because we want to improve dogs and also because we want to have some enjoyment from doing so. Some people get just too serious about trivia - and I can't say I enjoy dealing with that aspect of being KC Chairman.

Q. Finally where do you see yourself in five year's time?


A. Hopefully like today as I said at the start of this interview, "At home in King's Sutton just near to Banbury in Oxfordshire"!

Introducing Peter Green: Crufts Best in show judge 2009

ETER GREEN, our 2009 Crufts BIS judge, has been described as 'an icon', 'one of the most successful dog people ever', 'one of the foremost professional handlers in the USA'; and when asked what he would be looking for when he stepped into the main ring at the NEC to judge BIS at 'the greatest dog show in the world' (during an interview with Heidi Hudson at the Eukanuba Invitational in Longbeach), his reply was simple: 'something special - excellence of type and character, plus sparkle and quality'!

(although he has handled dogs across he was soon tempted back to Amerall the groups), Peter started his ica, in 1963, this time as journey to success at the age of 10, helping his uncle Harold Snow of the world famous Felstead Welsh Terrier kennelin Wales. At 18 years old he was drafted into the RAF and spent the next two years in the North of England, where he attended dog shows with some really good terrier men from that area'. After his time in the RAF he started doing some professional handling and was noticed by one of the great terrier men of the time, Jacky Parker of the Wycote kennels. It was he who first sent Peter to the United States, in 1958, to work at the newly opened Trucote terrier kennels in Malibu, California, where on his first day he met his lifelong friend and mentor Ric Chashondian.

Homesick after just 15 months. Peter and his wife returned to Wales where he handled dogs for the next few years, including some of George

Best known in the terrier world $\,$ and Olive Jackson's (Jokyl). However, manager/handler of the highly regarded Pool Forge kennels, not far from his current home of Bowmansville, Pennsylvania.

In 1967 Peter set up business in Bowmansville as a Public Handler. His many handling accomplishments in the States since then include: 8 BIS at Montgomery, the prestigious terrier show; 4 BIS at Westminster; and 6 Top Dogs All Breeds (5 of whom he handled, the other imported by him but handled by his partner Beth

Peter's Crufts successes include breeding the 2001 BOB Airedale, Ch/Am/It Ch Greenfield Captain Fantastic (one of the first pet passport BOBs at the show); and you will recall that he piloted the UK-bred Norfolk, Ch/Am Ch Cracknor

Cause Celebre (Coco), to the top spot in 2005, which made him the only living person (and one of only two ever) to have handled a dog to BIS at both Westminster and Crufts.


In the 'human awards' department, Peter has won the Kennel Review Male Handler of the Year four times; and is a recipient of the Bow Tie Dogs In Review Lifetime Achievement Award. Obviously happy to pass on his handling expertise, he is co-author (with Mario Migliorini) of the highly successful book 'New Secrets of Show Dog Handling' (2002).


Since 1976 Peter has judged at the highest level across the world. He retired as a professional handler at Westminster 2006, and is now an AKC-approved judge. Last year he was back in Europe to judge the International Junior Handling competition at the World Show in Stockholm.

Anne Macdonald - Hound Group

THERE was always a dog at home while Anne was growing up and following in her mother's footsteps she began exhibiting in the late 50s with a Pembroke Welsh Corgi. A great deal of knowledge and experience was gained in these early years when attending local shows as a

teenager and watching such judges as Joe Braddon, Bill Siggers, Judy de Casembroot and Lily Turner. After marrying and settling down to have a family Anne's interest moved to the hound group and in 1970 she purchased her first Saluki from Hope Waters' Burydown kennel and registered the Mabrooka kennel name. She won her first CC in 1973 from Dorothy Whitwell with her foundation bitch Burydown Badawiyah - all of her dogs descend from this bitch line Despite breeding very few litters Anne has won over 100 CCs and owned/bred 13 Champions in this

breed, including the BCC record holder, Ch Saklawi Bishah of Mabrooka and her grandson Ch Mabrooka Jayid - one of the most successful dogs in the breed of all time. He won the Hound Group at Crufts in 2002 whilst in 2003 he

was Top Hound All Breeds and second in the Group and on his last appearance at Crufts in 2005 he achieved third place in Group. In total he won 12 Groups, four general Ch show BIS and the Pedigree Champion Stakes finals in both 2002 and 2003 - a unique achievement. Anne stopped breeding in 1999 and has recently become more involved with the administration side of the world of dogs. Anne began judging in 1964 and awarded her first set of CCs in 1981. Her first Group appointment was in 1994 at Windsor and she is now approved to judge 21 hound breeds and both Pembroke and Cardigan Corgis in the Pastoral Group. Anne's judging appointments regularly take her overseas to Australia and the USA as well as to various European countries. BRENDA has been showing dogs since the early 1960s and has made up homebred Champions in Pugs, Pyrenean Mountain Dogs and Schip-perkes. She has also won well with her Belgian Shepherd Groenendael which she bought both as a show dog and as a

Chris Bexon - Gundog Group

AS A child Chris was fascinated by animals. From a very small age he kept a variety of animals as pets, from household canines - his first dog being a corgi and the second being a Miniature Poodle - where, of course, living on the edge of the countryside the Poodle was a constant companion on almost daily escapades. As a child Chris kept a small snake, insects, snails, birds and the odd rodent. At school he looked after the animals in the Science department during his breaks and would take more exotic animals home at holiday times much to the shock and

alarm of his mother. He was also Secretary of the school's first Ornithological club and relished trips all over the country to catch, ring, measure and generally study wild birds.

Together with his wife, Chris started what was to become the Oldfield Kennel in 1974. Due to work commitments the kennel has been relatively small and the dogs are companions first and foremost. However, although only a small kennel. Chris has owned or bred six Show Champions at home and abroad plus a couple of Junior Warrant winners Their first English Setter bitch was acguired in 1974 and was to become Sh



Ch Jetsett Canopus of Oldfield the top winning English Setter bitch in 1979. Other breeds were to follow: a Pointer, Italian Spinone and a Sealyham Terrier - 'variety being the spice of life,' and not forgetting the Sussex Spaniels - of particular note is the current breed record holder, the homebred Sh Ch Harvest Glow of Oldfield who won 29 CCs. I Group and two reserve Groups together with finishing fourth Top Gundog in the Dog World/Pedigree Chum Top Dog competition in 1990 - satisfactory achievements for a numerically small breed. Chris is a founder member of the Dukeries Gundog Club, Midland English Setter Society and the Irish Red and White Club of GB, of which he was the President for a number of years. He has held positions as President, Vice President, Vice Chairman and Secretary to 'all breed clubs' breed clubs, group and sub-group associations, during a span of thirty years. He has compiled two Champions books for the Sussex Spaniel

Association and is working on the third volume which will cover the thirty years of the breed's history. He was KC Area Liaison Council representative for Notts and Derby in the late eighties and breed liaison council rep for Italian Spinone and Sussex Spaniels. Chris is probably better recognised today as the Secretary of the National Gundog Association, a post he has held for the last eleven years.

Chris started judging in 1977 and gave his first set of CCs in Sussex Spaniels in 1983 followed by CCs in English Setters in 1985. He is now passed to award CCs in thirteen breeds within the group. He judged his first Group at the Welsh Kennel Club in 1996 and has judged the group regularly since then. Judging abroad in New Zealand, Australia, South Africa, Finland, Sweden, mainland Europe, he now hopes to travel to

Chris is looking forward to judging the Gundog Group at Crufts this year.

Ernie Paterson - Utility Group

ERNIE has been breeding and showing dogs since the late 1960s under the Camargue Prefix, which is best known for Dalmatians. In this particular breed alone Ernie has bred or shown an impressive ten English

A young Robin started showing Borzoi and Alsatians in his early teens - he often points out that in those days one didn't ask if you could judge, you were invited when your elders and betters thought it was the right time and that you had enough knowledge

It was from a young age that Robin began to show interest in other breeds including Shetland Sheepdogs, Bulldogs, Beagles, Smooth Fox Terriers, Papillons, Rough Collies, Afghans, Australian Cattle Dogs and Great Danes - and for this he thanks those senior judges and breeders who were so generous with their knowledge of such breeds. knowledge gained as a young man that he has been able to make up over 29 UK Champions and many overseas Cham-

Robin has also played a large role in the administration side of things. He has been Chairman of the English Toy Terrier Club, the Greater London OES Club, the East Anglian Secretary for the Shetland Sheepdog Club and is currently Chairman of the Bulldog Breed Council. He was also with Suffolk Agricultural Show for 24 years. An all-rounder judge he has awarded over 40 sets of CCs spanning the

Harry O'Donoghue - Terrier Group

HARRY was brought up in a farming environment and has been keenly interested in animals from a young age. His Grandfather (an Englishman from Banbury who settled in Ireland) taught young Harry about animals and poultry. When he was seven years-old his grandfather presented him with a Jack Russell bitch puppy and he continued owning Jack

Russells for the next 55 years.
In his early teens Harry was attracted to the challenge of breeding show canaries and together with his uncle became successful in produc ing quality show birds. Soon he was appointed Secretary of the local Cage Bird Club and organised many shows for more than 10 years. He still breeds cage birds although he has no time to show them In 1953 Harry purchased his first pedigree dog – a male Lakeland Terrier. He was shown a number of times with little suc-

cess. Harry then acquired a female from England who did some good winning but she was barren. Eventually he purchased the Lakeland Champion Tindale Twist and a Blackwell bitch. He took the Black from the Blackwell and the Dale from the Tindale and created his own pre-fix 'Blackdale'. From 1959 until 1971 he produced several Lakeland Champions worldwide and in 1971 he won the Terrier Group at Crufts under Mr Jack Abbott with Ch Blackdale Handful. Harry continued breeding and showing Lakelands but soon turned his attention to breeding Wire Fox Terriers. He found it very difficult to acquire

decent foundation stock for this breed but by chance he found a very good bitch in Ireland which was sired by Mr Alex Barrett's famous Champion. At a subsequent Crufts show he bought a dog called Procne Scoutboy (sired by the well known Ch Townville Tallyho) from Mr Fred Sills snr.

In his first litter from this pair Multi Ch Blackdale Starbright emerged. Starbright was a prolific producer and sired, amongst many other winners, Eng & Ir Ch Blackdale Aristocrat who went on to become top Wire Fox Terrier in Ireland and England and won Best of Breed at Crufts on two consecutive years and the Wire Fox Terrier Association. He was also second in the Terrier Group at Crufts under Miss Linda Beak. Starbright later went to the Louline Kennels in Sweden where he won

A rare and remarkable talent

ICTOR AND Tim Griffiths are familar faces at shows throughout the year with their unique animal sculptures, here Features Editor, Helen Davenport Willis, asks Victor some questions

Q. Did you grow up in a doggy background?

A. Not really we had a dog called Whiskey when we were teenagers, he was a terrier/mongrel and lived until he was about 17 years of age.

Q. Do you own a dog at the present and if so what breed?

A. My wife likes anything that resembles a Stafford so we currently have three. Ty(son) – not my choice of name – ate all the apples off my apple tree over the period of a week. After that he ate the tree down to a stump. Is this normal? Tim has two Border Collies that produced eight puppies just before Christmas – still looking for homes for a couple.

Q. When did you first realise that you had such a talent and how did you develop it?

A.Always liked art at school but they only taught modern art. It all started by accident for me when I attended an industrial ceramics course. Tim attended the same course a few years later. I started sculpting wild animals such as the fox, otter and stag. Tim spotted the potential for selling at dog shows when a Craft Fair that we were at was next to the Midland Collie Dog show. The Rough Collie has always since that time held a special place for us and that is reflected in the Rough Collie sculptures that we produce

Q. At what stage did you start your own business?

A.We started our business in the early 80s in the front room of my terraced house in Longton, Stoke-on-Trent with the help of our late father Jim and our mother May. We moved to Devils Bridge in 1986 when we ran out of room and there we met our future wives, settled down and raised our families.

Q. What components go into making your models?

A. The original sculpture is made out of clay or wax then moulded. We then cast them in a resin bonded ceramic. We are able to have them cast in foundry Bronze on request. We also have a small range of Dog Designer Jewellery which is cast in silver or gold and has our own distinct hallmark making them unique.

Q. Are they individually hand painted?

A. Tim does most of the casting, pigmenting each one individually. I then finish the process with the painting of the top coats. The sculptures are often painted to photographs at the request of the owner so that they have a permanent memory of their treasured pet. It is a very labour intensive process from start to finish and takes a lot of time and dedication to produce each piece to the standard that our customers expect.

Q. One of the main attributes of a dog judge is 'an eye' for a good dog, for balance, harmony, structure, etc. Would you agree that this also applies to you?

A. Definitely, I often spot a winner. However, the help that I get from their owners is invaluable, their knowledge is vast and it is the amalgam of that which allows me to produce the sculptures that I do.

Q. Do you ever read dog books to get your eye in?

 $\boldsymbol{A}.$ I spend a fortune on books, magazines, and photos, our house is swamped with information.

Q. What breeds do you prefer working on and do you use live models?

A. Live models at every opportunity. As I said before I have always had a soft spot for Rough Collies, but I do like a challenge which is why the range is now so large. I have to admit my least favourite dog currently is probably a Stafford (can you guess why?)

Q. What plans do you have in the pipeline?

A. We have just had a short, much needed holiday to Egypt and I would like to do a sculpture of Nefertiti. I never know what sculpture to do next it just happens. I have a lump of clay or wax and start. At the end of the day it is my ambition to model all the breeds people have requested, some of whom have been waiting patiently for years. It all takes time, each sculpture takes up to a month to make and that is working at least eight hours a day and five days per week.

Q. What venues do you use to sell and display your work?

A. Obviously we go to Dog shows in various parts of the country, the largest by far being Crufts. Tim spends a lot of his time on the road especially during the summer months. We have a web site www.vicandtimsculptures.com which we need to develop further so that we can sell more over the net to try and reduce some of the costs, so we also provide a postal service where we can.

Top Five Tips

Trust me; this is not the time to get experimental with your pet's digestive tract.

3. No doggy in the window! Dogs absolutely love to stick their heads out the window and smell the air as it rushes by. Though it's sad to deprive them of this enjoyment, many dogs are injured when road debris or insects fly into their eyes, nostrils or windpipe. They can also become ill by having cold air forced into their lungs. What's more, dogs have accidentally strangulated themselves by stepping on the electric window control. So keep the dog inside.

4. Take frequent breaks. A dog's legs need to be stretched just like yours do — perhaps twice as much. Your pet also needs water, exercise and potty breaks at regular intervals. Having your dog lie beneath the café table while you eat lunch is not exercise, so be sure to take him or her a walk before jumping back in the car. Taking time for your pet may also help you to take in some interesting sights along your trip.

5: If you don't like the though of lumping crates with you, there are some really good restraints on the market which will make sure your dogs are safe while travelling. It's also a good idea to cover your car's upholstery and cover important buttons, such as electric window controls etc

Taking your dog abroad Here's some things you need to know:

Microchip your dog: Your dog needs to be microchipped. Check this procedure and the costs with your vet.

It is highly recommended that after your dog is microchipped it is registered with Petlog, the largest pet reunification scheme in the UK, as this can prove extremely effective in locating a lost pet. The Petlog Premium service can even alert local vets and dog wardens when an owner sends a SMS text message to say where their pet was lost. You can also include your dog's PETS Passport Number on your Petlog Premium record. Petlog is a member of the European Pet Network so can still help to get your dog back to you if you lose him when on holiday – but remember to add your holiday details to your pet's record on Petlog before you travel by telephoning 0870



Vaccinate your dog against Rabies: Your dog must be vaccinated 21 days prior to travel. Check this procedure and the cost with your vet. A month after the vaccination, a blood test is taken to make sure it has cre ated enough antibodies. A passport is then issued once confirmed. All UK vaccinations have a validity period of 2-3 years, however, listed countries do differ. Please check with the authorities of the country you are travelling to for further information.

What about quarantine? When the passport has been issued the dog can travel to any of the countries in the PETS Travel Scheme and return to



the UK six calendar months from the date the blood test is drawn without

Other considerations: Check whether your dog can travel with the airline and ferry company you wish to use. You can travel by Eurotunnel but NOT by Eurostar (assistance dogs only).
If you travel by plane and will be accompanying your dog, some airlines

may allow you to book your dog in as excess baggage as opposed to cargo, which usually works out cheaper. Your dog must fly in an IATA approved crate and you should check with the airline about how to measure your dog for an IATA approved crate. Airlines should provide information guides on how to do this

Most ferry companies will not allow dogs up on to the decks so your dog vill need to stay in the car throughout the duration of the crossing. Some ferry companies will allow you to check your dog throughout the crossing but you are advised to check before travel. For foot passengers, some companies do have kennels on the car decks. If you decide to take a ferry crossing, make sure your dog will be happy to sleep in the vehicle or in a kennel (whichever you choose) throughout the duration of the crossing.

Before booking your holiday accommodation, ensure that the hotel or guest house will accept dogs. Most places on the continent are dog-friendly but, be advised you will normally be expected to pay a fee per dog.

Consider travel insurance which covers your pet for emergency over-

seas veterinary and kennel costs.

What should I do whilst I am abroad? Before travelling in a car, gradually accustom your dog to car travel by taking your dog on short journeys.

Always ensure your dog has plenty of ventilation and shade in the car

Train your dog not to bark or move around excessively whilst your car is

and that fresh drinking water is readily available.

in motion, as this can be very distracting to the driver.

Check the regulations for travelling by car for the country you are visit-

ing as some countries insist that dogs wear canine seat belts or be carried

Transport your dog safely, preferably by using a special dog guard, dog cage or canine harness. Your dog will be better protected and feel more secure if he has his own space in the car rather than being 'squashed' in with

When taking your dog on a long journey, ensure you make regular stops to exercise your dog. Remember always to clean up after your dog in any

Make certain your dog is kept on a lead in all public places.

Ensure your dog is sociable and obedient. This can be done through the Kennel Club Good Citizen Dog Scheme, which is a fun and enjoyable way of training your dog to be sociable and provides essential advice on responsible dog ownership.



Make sure your dog wears an identification collar and tag with your current contact details. The Control of Dogs Order 1992 advises that any dog in a public place must wear a collar tag with the name and address of the owner written on it. The phone number is optional (but advisable). It is well worth adding your address while on holiday to your dog's tag even if this is done simply by means of sticky tape over the current tag. The Kennel Club can provide these tags - log on to www.thekennelclub.org.uk for further information.

What about coming back to the UK?

To come back into the UK your dog must have a tick and tapeworm treatment administered by a vet not less than 24 hours and not more than 48 hours before you check-in with an approved transport company for the journey that brings your dog in to the UK. The vet has to sign the passport to say this has been carried out. If you are only going on a day trip, the tick/tapeworm treatment has to be administered before you leave the UK in order to comply with the 24 - 48 hour rule.

The passport and the dog's microchip number are checked before re-

turning to the UK in the "PETS check point". This check has to be paid for when you purchase your tickets initially.

If you are importing a dog from abroad then it has to have a Pet Passport

(the same as a UK dog travelling abroad).





The Bracco Italiano: Definitely a Ferrari in the field!

by Mik Jacques

■HE BRACCO is an ancient breed, being first mentioned in the time. Those Bracchi made a huge fourth and fifth centuries BC. The most probable theory of its origins are that it evolved from the Molossus and the Egyptian Hound. Bracchi are the forefathers of many of today's modern sporting dogs. This dog is one of the classic and ancient pointers, selected originally mainly in the northern regions of the Italian peninsula.



As well as his distinctive head the Bracco moves with an extended trot which distinguishes it from any other breed

orange variety originated in Piedmont and the roan-and-brown in Lombardy; in fact people spoke of a Lombard pointer (the roan-and-brown) and a Piedmontese pointer Bracco are r (the white-and-orange).

The Piedmontese variety was of lighter construction and smaller size for its work in the mountains whilst the Lombard variety was a larger heavier type. In 1923 it was agreed to amalgamate the two types into one breed with a single breed standard, reference to the standard will show that a wide range in size and weight is allowed with the possibility of bitches being significantly heavier and taller than

the dogs.

The breed has been present in its current form since the Middle Ages and became widespread in the Renaissance period. It was held in very high regard by the nobility. In fact, area feathered game hunting was an ex-clusive pastime of the aristocracy. It was bred by the Gonzaga and Medici families; the subjects born in those kennels were sought out by nobles and royal families.

Centuries ago hunters in Italy developed the Bracco for the specific purpose of working - to drive game into the hunters' nets. With the invention of the gun the role changed to that of the HPR to which it has remained faithful to the present day. Although the breed developed to accommodate the huntersl needs the breed has remained very true to type.

Strong instincts

The Bracco is the most hound like of all the gundog breeds and facially more akin to the bloodhound or basset hound however he is a true gundog; a stylish and enthusiastic hunter, has a superb nose, will hold a staunch point and retrieve keenly to hand. Their excellent nose coupled with strong hound instincts means that they have no fear of get-

a high scent but will also take ground scent. They take lines on scent and can quickly be at a dis-

Bracco are not naturally sight hounds so are not guilty of being big chasers but scent is so important to them that they can be oblivious to all around them once they have taken the scent.

The Italians train their dogs with a harness (called a Bragga), which accentuates the natural trotting action which these dogs already have but give them a quicker extended trot. To see them race through a vineyard is an unforgettable experi-

Here in Britain, they are being used as picking up dogs. They excel on runners on undisturbed ground but can be inhibited where people and dogs have polluted the scent

Field Trials

In Italy the Bracco is held in high esteem as a working gundog and the breed has more field trial entries than any other breed. Its popularity has outstripped all the other gundog breeds available in Italy including the Spinone. There are approximately 700 puppies born each year in Italy.

In Italy, the rules to gain the Italian Champion title are more restrictive than in other countries where the dog does not have to be successful in a working trial in order to achieve the National Championship. These Italian rules do mean that the dog that is inept at hunting cannot became an Italian Beauty Champion and that the aim for which the breed has been selected for centuries remains unchanged. A dog must gain the qualification of at

It is thought that the white-and- ting lost. When hunting they favour least Very Good in a working trial. Only then may the dog compete in the working class, the only class from which the CAC is awarded. In order to obtain the Championship the dog has to win the working class with: first excellent CAC at four shows at least two of which at International Shows and one at Club matches or at Specialty Shows. The five CACs have to be won under at least four different

judges.
Perhaps the most famous figure in the history of this breed was Ferdinando Delor de Ferrabouc, dog fancier, hunter, show and field trials judge, and founder of the Italian Kennel Club

His Braccos, Spinoni, Pointers and Setters were the main winners of the exhibitions between the nineteenth and the twentieth century, giving an enduring mark to the

breeding of these breeds.

To pay homage to Ferdinando
Delor, every year a Trophy in his name is contested by pointing dogs: the best Italian, the best European and the best English are in the ring of honour. The Delor Kennel was born as Canile della Caccia in 1882 and contines to this day through the grandaughter (Lucia) of Ferdinando. Following WWII Paolo Ciceri of the Dei Ronchi kennel was instrumental in reviving the breed.

When judging the breed it is important to look for the correct movement (extended trot with head held above the topline) and a correct head, the Italian breed standard pays a lot of attention to the head, skull and facial region with detailed descriptions and ideal dimen-

Zerbo

Ionathan and Liz Shaw were responsible for bringing the breed to the UK. In 1988 whilst visiting a field trial in Italy to see Spinone they encountered the Bracco for the first

impression on them and subsequently in the spring of 1989 the first Bracco arrived in quarantine in the UK. He was called Zerbo. From those beginnings a continuing number of Bracchi have been imported into the UK. During the period from 1989 up to 1999 only 7 litters were bred in the UK (1 in quarantine). This "quality not quantity" approach to breeding ensured that the breed remained true to type and ensured a firm foundation for its continuing future in the UK.To date in the UK 42 litters (300+ puppies) have been bred from 19 different kennels with a total of 33 imports not only from Italy but from Scandinavia, the Low Countries and Hungary. There are many diverse bloodlines within the country and with enthusiasts utilising the pet passport scheme, not only to compete against continental opposition but also to mate bitches to dogs who would otherwise be unavailable it is hoped that the breed can continue to develop with a broad base of bloodlines to choose from.

As with all societies, during its ten year history the Bracco Italiano Society has had its ups and downs but the committee have pulled to-Harrison's Shaneco Daniele De

gether, and managed a successful application for the move from the Imported Breeds Register to the Breed Register at the first attempt, allowing the breed to take its place in the Gundog group from 1st January last year.

The society have, over the years, held many events including three breed seminar's with speakers from Italy, Denmark and Holland. The society held a breed match judged by Mr Frank Kane in 2006, and their first Open Show in October 2008 judged by Dr Gianercole Mentasti from the breeds homeland. They have also held a number of working tests and last year for the first time a Spring Pointing test, the working events have been well supported not only from within the breed, but from other HPR enthusiasts as well The society publishes an annual yearbook.

Good health!

The recent removal from the Import Register has obviously allowed a number of firsts to be achieved perhaps the most notable to date being the Best In Show at SheringRossi and the Show Certificate of Merit achieved by both John & Hazel Abrahams Ardenstorm Luciano Bosis and Shaneco Daniele De Rossi.

Perhaps the highest achievement previously was by Mr & Mrs March's Homstar Angelina who was Top Import Register (all groups) in 2003.

The breed in general has a good health record, the society appointed a breed health co-ordinator at the outset in Dr Ros Roden. The main areas to note are hips and entropian and ectropian, there have also been cases of Cherry eyes, allergies and instances of the front legs of some puppies bowing, the legs do however seem to straighten out satis-factorily aided by restricted exercise. There were two cases of UAP reported in one litter, but to date elbow testing within the breed has not revealed a problem. We have also recently had two reported cases of Glaucoma and this condition is currently being monitored by the committee

Hopefully the breed (which is described as "a Ferrari in the field") will make a positive contribution to the UK dog scene, not only in the show ring but in the working arena

The Portuguese Podengo

a remarkable success story by Betty Judge

T SEEMS a long time since 2002, when I started the long journey to bring the Portuguese Podengo to these shores; however it will not look very long to other people, especially those who have other imported breeds which have moved very slowly in their development.

in those seven years I have put fourteen years (or more!) worth of work (and definitely money) in promoting and establishing the breed here, and travelling and showing the breed at every opportunity in Europe. I suppose even in my wildest dreams could not have visualised that the Podengo would be in the ring at Crufts in 2009, even though you dream they will be while waiting for each stage to pass.

Having seen so many breeds sit-

ting almost stagnant on the Import Register was enough for me to know that there was a lot of hard work to be done. The breed being recognised by the Kennel Club on October 1st 2003 was a great relief to me, as I had applied for two other breeds for recognition prior to the Podengo application and those breeds were turned down and were given a three year moratorium. With this happening it gave me the op-portunity to work solely for the Podengos' future.

Keen

I was very keen to get started, as you will see, and I drove to the Kennel Club Registration Department in Aylesbury, for 9 am on the 1st October 2003 to register the first 31 Podengos that by that time I had imported and bred, however the poor lady who did the imports at the office was astonished that I expected them to be done while \boldsymbol{I} waited. She explained that because she had to copy all the pedigree

It is nearly seven years since the breed came to the UK, but possibly take quite some time, so I sorted take quite some time, so I sorted out the important ones to be registered that day, these being the Podengos which had been imported that I had bred from and the resulting puppies, which had no registrations at all so I was unable to exhibit

them even in Europe.

She said if I went back at four o'clock she would do as many as possible, and by that time she had very kindly registered 16 Podengos and assured me she would do the rest as quickly as possible. On my return home that same day I posted the Application for the Podengo Interim Breed Standard to the Kennel Club, but it was some time later before it reached the Kennel Club's Breed Standards and Stud Book Sub-committees Agenda.

A presentation was sent a little later with all the information required and the Breed Standard Application went before the committee at least four times before it was approved. Mr Graham Hill, the Hound Representative on that Committee, worked very hard for the breed, and eventually the Interim Breed Standard was approved late in 2005, allowing us to start to exhibit Podengos in the Import Register Classes from the 1st January

Dominated

From then on the Hound Import Register classes were dominated by Podengos, and many times we were the only breed there, and I do know several people with other Import Hounds were as delighted as we were when we were transferred from the Import into the Breed Register, so that they could get back to having just a few of their own breed dogs in the classes again!

The entry of Podengos at the first Import Classes Podengos were entered at was at Oxfordshire Canine Open Show, there were 31 imports entered of which 29 were Podengos, Mr. Per Iverson from Norway judged and two smooth Podengos went Best Import and Best Import Puppy, Melro do Far-robo de Plushcourt (imp) and Plushcourt Beijar respectively. At the Championship Shows the Podengo entries were remarkable, and it was decided that during May of 2006 (even though it was the first year in mport Register Classes) to apply to be transferred to the Breed Register. This may have appeared very soon to some, but knowing by this time that the KC's BS & SB Sub-Committees Agenda was extremely busy and usually took a long to time to get on to, time was of the essence.

Spanish Water Dogs are medium sized, active and quick thinking dogs with a workmanlike, natural curly coat. They come in a variety of colours which can be solid, with white markings or parti-coloured. Colours not accepted are black and tan, brown and

tative selection of quality animals.

tan or tri-coloured. The coat when short is dense and curly forming tight ringlets, when longer these taper to a wispy point. This gives the appearance of cords but they should not be felted, heavy or have blunt ends. The accepted practice, to reflect the way they were kept in Spain, is to clip the coat off at least once a year.

The clip should be even all over with no parts of the body being left with longer hair, as with some curly coated breeds. The only grooming required is done by hand, separating the cords as they develop. It is incorrect to brush or comb the coat, which should be natural and rustic, affording protection against the elements. Swimming improves the quality of the curl. Accepted lengths of coat vary from three to twelve centimetres and any length between.

Ancient

The Spanish Water Dog (Perro de Agua Espanol) is an ancient breed, its curly coated ancestors having been recorded as

far back as the Eighth Century in its native country of Spain. This breed has worked alongside farmers and fisherman for hundreds of years in relative anonymity until very recently. There are several theories regarding the origins of this ancient breed but none has been proved beyond doubt, although there are records of this breed being closely linked with the introduction of Merino sheep from North Africa but the dogs themselves are possibly descended from curly coated breeds of the Eastern Mediterranean, in particular, Turkey.

These quick thinking, active and agile little dogs were used within a pastoral setting as herders of flocks living and flourishing in the salt marshes of Andalucia. Ultimately, they travelled to other parts of Spain, following the movement of flocks across the Iberian Peninsular.

In the north of Spain the dogs were utilised by fishermen and taken out in the boats, where their aquatic talents were put to good use. Spanish Water Dogs are expert at retrieving in water from the surface and to depths of several metres. They were used to pull boats to shore and for guarding the catch

This breed, within a rural setting, proved to be multi-talented and was ultimately used for a variety of purposes, being quick to adapt to whatever was asked. Spanish Water Dogs are very responsive to training, quick to learn and can think on their feet. They have a superior scenting ability, great agility and the tenacity to remain on task, making them a useful asset to their owners.

Rediscovered

The breed remained virtually unknown even in its native country until the 1980s when it was 'rediscovered' by two people, Santiago

The dogs were then presented to the Kennel Club of Spain for recognition in 1983 when a breed standard was drawn up and in 1985 the countries. breed was provisionally accepted in Spain and by the FCI. Antonio Garcia Perez became and still is the foremost authority on Spanish Water Dogs and is considered world wide as 'The Father of the Breed'.

It was in 1992 when a group of four people travelled from The UK to The World Show in Valencia and saw for the first time a number of Spanish Water Dogs. Together they problems have been well docuformed a partnership and organised the importation of two dogs and two bitches into the UK to begin a breeding programme in this country. From those first imports a small number of litters were produced and, in due course, other owners and breeders became involved in developing the breed by importing further dogs and bitches and so increasing the size of the gene pool.

Since those early days, the numcountry has increased exponentially seven hundred registered with the Kennel Club, the gene pool having been significantly widened by the importation of even more dogs from Spain and other European

Foundation

In order to establish a firm foundation within the UK for this breed, the Spanish Water Dog Club was formed in 2002. The Club has high on its list of priorities, the health and welfare of the breed and has made every effort to ensure that health mented so that all owners and breeders are informed and educated regarding these issues. A comprehensive code of ethics ensures that breeding by members is carried out in a responsible manner in order to ultimately eliminate unwanted inherited traits and potential puppy owners are made aware of known health issues.

ities for owners to participate in with their dogs and these reflect the numerous skills these dogs are capable of being trained to acquire. Included are water-work, land tests, gundog work, search work, agility, flyball or just having lots of fun at a doggy party.

Perhaps most importantly, the vast majority of owners in this country wish to see the breed remain as it was and still is in its native country, an active, agile dog hot-wired to work and retaining its natural rustic appearance. To allow any changes to creep in would be a travesty. Let's hope we continue to promote the Spanish Water Dog as it is now.



The Dogue de Bordeaux: a Crufts debut for the gentle giant

HE DOGUE de Bordeaux embodies probably the most successful story of all the Molosser breeds. Just over fifty years ago the breed had almost died out, but luckily over the next twenty to thirty years the breed became stronger and stronger in numbers. This was mainly in France, its country of origin, but by the beginning of the eighties the Dogue de Bordeaux started to draw attention from fanciers around the world.

Today this gentle giant can be found in most countries around the world, within the UK the Dogue de Bordeaux has gained in popularity with a dedicated core of exhibitors and breeders promoting our breed in and around the UK and Europe

Since the Kennel Club recognised the breed in 1997 the registration figures have grown steadily, by the end of 2008 the Dogue de Bordeaux was on the edge of the top twenty breeds within the UK.

But where does this wonderful breed originate from?

The Dogue de Bordeaux was known in France as early as the fourteenth century, particularly in southern France in the region around Bordeaux.

The history of the breed is believed to predate the Bullmastiff and the Bulldog. Some believe that the Dogue can be found in the background of the Bullmastiff, and others claim that the Dogue and Mastiff breeds were both

being accomplished at the same time.

Another theory is the Dogue de Bordeaux originates from the Tibetan Mastiff and it is also said that the Dogue is related to the Greco Roman molossoids used for war, as there was a breed similar to the Dogue de Bordeaux in Rome at the time of Julius Caesar's reign, possibly a cousin of the

Others suggest that the Dogue de Bordeaux is a descendent of a breed which existed in ancient France, the Dogues de Bordeaux of Aquitaine.

The theory that is backed by Prof Raymond Triquet is that the Dogue de Bordeaux accompanied English sailors on trade ships entering the port of Bordeaux. The dogs were used to trade with the locals of Bordeaux for various items. It is strongly believed that this is when the term "Dogue" was first used as the French locals could not pronounce the word "Dog". Hence the name Dogue de Bordeaux or Dog of Bordeaux. Whichever theory is true, it is obvious that the Dogue de Bordeaux shares the same common links as all modern molossers

Jobs

The Dogue de Bordeaux was once classified into three varieties, the Parisian, the Toulouse and the Bordeaux, types which were bred depending on the region of France and the jobs they were required to do.

In 1863 the first canine exhibition was held at the "Jardin d'Acclimatation" in Paris, France. The winner of the Dogue de Bordeaux was a bitch named Magentas. The Dogue de Bordeaux was then given the name

of the capital of their region of origin, today's Dogue de Bordeaux. The Dogue de Bordeaux was used as a hunter, a herding dog, and a guardian. They were trained to bait bulls, bears, and jaguars, hunt boars, herd cattle, and protect the homes, butcher shops, and vineyards of their masters. It is believed that Napoleon himself owned the breed and that they went with him during his campaigns. It was also prized as protectors and was often found in the homes of the wealthy of France. A setback in the breed came during the French Revolution when many of the Dogue de Bordeaux perished with their wealthy masters. The Dogue de Bordeaux of the common man then thrived.

These became champions, and were powerful dogs bred to do their jobs and do them well. Another setback for the breed was during World War II, Adolf Hitler was said to have demanded the execution of all Dogue de Bordeaux because of their devout loyalty to their owners, others say that the French breeders destroyed their dogs to stop the Germans using them as war dogs against the allied forces.

Rebuilt

During the 1960s, a group of breeders of the Dogue de Bordeaux in France, headed by Raymond Triquet, worked on the rebuilding of the foundation of the breed. In 1970 a new FCI standard was written for the breed, with the most recent update in 1995.

As mentioned before, the Dogue de Bordeaux was recognised by the

Kennel Club in 1997. From that point on a dedicated group of owners campaigned at every opportunity to get the breed known to the dog community of the UK. You would find us all at both Discover Dogs every year without fail talking to thousands of interested people. The first club was formed in the late nineties and regular fun days were held for all Dogue owners to attend.

In 2001 the first interim breed standard was produced and the Dogue de Bordeaux could be exhibited for the first time within the Import Register. In that year the first BOB went to my own imported male Vinnie Du Domain De Frimarque from Holland. He also went on to be the first top dog for the breed in the same year. Over the years many dogs have been imported in to the UK from all over the world to increase the gene pool, some kennels have taken their dogs to be mated abroad to the top

dogs of Europe. It is ironic that in such a short amount of time other countries are now looking to the UK to improve their stock.







bred dog has stood out more than others. Not only for what it has won in the ring but has made its mark with its progeny. One dog stood out, Temple Fel-

In 2003 Temple Felson dominated the show ring across Europe. The same year he became the Junior World winner, Dutch Club Winner, Amsterdam Winner and finally Best In Show at the Dogachtigien Show in Holland.

In 2004 Temple Felson returned to the UK where he lived with John and Loraine Large and sired many of today's winning dogs. Early in 2006 this ambassador of the breed lost his life to bloat but his memory continues within his progeny. One of these was the winner of the French club match in 2007, Rozeldogue Templeson, owned and bred by

Ben Dunning.

Moving forward to 2008 and the first year that the Dogue de Bordeaux was exhibited within its own breed classes at UK shows. This was a tremendous step forward for the breed. Keeping to the theme of English bred dogs that have stood out for the year I have selected Int Ch & Ir Ch Jerivindi

Juno is another son of Temple Felson and I have had the pleasure of judging this dog myself. In 2008 he gained his title of International Champion by being awarded three BOB's at UK championship shows, these were awarded by the only three breed specialists who judged at this level in 2008. The first was given by myself, second by Shaun Cairns (Cairnshaw) and he was made



up by Carol Cavanagh (Shimano). In October Juno won the first Open show eld by the Dogue de Bordeaux Club of Great Britain judged by Janet Gunn.

The Dogue de Bordeaux within the UK is in safe hands with a dedicated breed club committee and the support of its members. It will be interesting to see how far the breed will develop over the coming years and I look forward in reflecting on another ten years of this wonderful dog and the people who have been captivated by them.

Meet the Breeder

Becky & Nik Swainston talk to Kerry Rushby

1. Becky & Nik, when did you first become involved in Dogues? We bought our first puppy Nellie, Belle of the North for Emberez in 2001,

I remember bringing her home, we were so excited about our new Dogue De Bordeaux puppy. We had been saving up the money and reading up about the breed for what felt like a lifetime before we made the step but she was worth the wait. After Nellie we were hooked.

2. What year did you first encounter a Dogue?
I think it was around 1999 and after seeing him I knew I had to have one. I (Becky) was working as a veterinary nurse as the time and was on call when "Claude" stayed at the hospital. He was in for exploratory work on his knee it turned out to be nothing but Nik came to visit me at work took one look at Claude and said the same as me "we have to have one"

3. How did you establish your lines?
Although Nellie was our first female and from the two litters she had, she produced four beautiful champions worldwide and was a very well structured female, she wasn't the type we preferred . When Anya came to us after admiring her litter brother Bronson for so long, we just knew we had to try and build our kennel from her progeny and this was our chance at doing something great in the breed. She had only one litter with us but in that litter produced Top female in France 2007 Emberez Aphrodite, Multi

Champion Emberez Apollo, Ch Emberez Aurora.

Anya is the reason we built up our friendship and partnership with Bart and Cressy from Van De Paterhoek kennels in Belgium. Bart visited our website and noticed we had puppies from Anya. Her son Emberez Apollo went to live with Bart and Cressy for two years, after which he returned to us in the UK, not before siring some of the top males in Europe including Enferno and Dillen Van De Paterhoek.

We base our kennel around Apollo and have two up and coming puppies who are his great grand children that we have high hopes for.

With a lot of hard work and dedication to breeding the Bronson type we have since teamed up with our other great friends and breed enthusiasts Tyrannus kennels in the UK and 2008 was definitely a year for our bloodline. I don't think any one particular bloodline with both males and females have been such prolific winners at the big events for the breed across Europe. 2008 was definitely our year.

4. Who have been your mentors, and what is your reason for selecting them?

Since before even having the breed we had been following the success of Gerard and Sheryl Van't Hul from in our opinion one of the most successful DDB kennels of all time "De La Maison De Hollande" in the Nether-

Gerard and Sheryl had a very well established type as we know it the "Bronson type" throughout their males and females.

Shortly after meeting Gerard and Sheryl we met Bart and Cressy from the Van De Paterhoek kennels in Belgium who we also admired immensely for their success in the ring and who shared the same love for the "Bronson type" as we do. We feel very lucky that we keep in touch with Gerard and Sheryl although they don't show or breed on the scale they used to but more so with Bart and Cressy who have become two of our very best friends along with Claire and Stephen.

5. Your prefix is Emberez - what is the origin of this name and when was this registered?

6. Did show ring success come quickly?

It came very quickly. We didn't really hit the show scene until 2003 and we won Best female in Show with Emberez Aphrodite at the biggest Show in the World for the breed in 2004. This win at the French Clubmatch 2004 sort of put us on the map and with Aphrodite's litter brother Emberez Apollo taking many of the major Best of Breeds in Europe that year it all went from

7. Have you tried to breed for a particular type?

The Bronson type, a famous dog born in the late nineties. "Red Thunder" This is the type we will always strive to produce, it the type that's in our hearts as the way a Dogue De Bordeaux should look and we share this love for the Bronson type with our partners Van De Paterhoek and Tyrannus. Our three kennels working together will hopefully give us more chance at achieving

8. What new blood have you introduced over the years and has it been successful for you?

From the start we have breeding to establish our type but over the past few years have made plans to bring new bloodlines into our kennel. We do find it very difficult to do this especially in the UK because it's very difficult to find a line we like as much as the one we have. However we have brought in some lines from Hollande and from a very beautiful UK bred dog, Temple Felson, by introducing Moby De Legeane to Renais a beautiful Apollo daughter owned by Tyrannus kennels. We have kept three pups back and we are very confident they have a very bright future.

9. Has any particular Dogue impressed you over the years?

I know I've mentioned him a lot but Bronson "Red Thunder" although only lightly shown this boy set the standard for the breed and really is the basis

10. Of your own Dogues, which has been your particular favourite &

This is a very hard question to answer as they have all been special in their own way, not just in the ring but for personal reasons but the success we two sweet boys, father and son Apollo and Enferno, puts them way up front but we wouldn't have the dogs we do today if it wasn't for our girl. Anya. who was Bronson's litter sister. She was our foundation female that we bought as an adult an without her we wouldn't be where we are today.

11. Have you any advice to pass on to newcomers in the breed?

Make your own judgement on breeders, dogs, kennels etc don't be influenced by others and always keep learning.
